President's Report:

Principal Report:

- Check your email for the Blue Family Folder (BFF) every Wednesday. A lot of information is packed in there with all the important links for different items.
- Have been asking for students to write prayers and then they are read to school.
- New York States Covid Zones- waiting to hear. It has been challenging. We have looked into the cost of getting Covid tests processed to fulfill state requirements and it is costly. We were able to partner up with Attica Pharmacy at no cost and do rapid tests. Email will be sent out to describe how the process will work. We have plenty of people volunteering to take the test. Doing the testing allows us to stay open during a designated orange zone status. It is overwhelming to do all of this, but allows us to stay open and do in person schooling. We should know by Wednesday 25th what color zone we will be. Please email with any questions.

- If we are designated a red zone, we could possibly be an emergency childcare site. Kindergarten and PreK classes would remain in person. Once we are approved for this, we might be able to take older kids since there are not many designated emergency childcare sites.
- School has to do 20% testing and it does not matter who the 20% are as long as ratio of student/teacher testing fits the guide lines.
- Transportation should not be affected, and we should know by Friday what the game plan will be.
